

THE COLONIAL PRISONERS REMOVAL ACT, 1884.

WHEREAS Frederick Linnell was on the 23rd day of January 1917 convicted before His Majesty's High Court of East Africa of the offence of Theft in a Dwelling House punishable under Section 380 of the Indian Penal Code and was sentenced to Rigorous Imprisonment for a term of one year AND WHEREAS the said Frederick Linnell was on the said 23rd day of January 1917 further convicted before the aforesaid High Court of the offence of cheating punishable under Section 420 of the Indian Penal Code and was sentenced to Rigorous Imprisonment for the term of one year AND WHEREAS the said Frederick Linnell was on the said 23rd day of January 1917 further convicted before the aforesaid High Court of the offence of using a forged document for the purpose of cheating under Sections 468 and 471 of the Indian Penal Code and was sentenced to Rigorous Imprisonment for the term of one year. AND WHEREAS the aforesaid sentences of one year Rigorous Imprisonment each were by order of the aforesaid High Court to run consecutively, and the said Frederick Linnell is now undergoing the aforesaid sentences in the Protectorate AND WHEREAS by reason of there being no prison in the Protectorate in which [the sentence of the said Frederick Linnell can] ~~affordably be carried into effect.~~

I do hereby in pursuance of the Colonial Prisoners Removal Act, 1884, with the concurrence of the Government of the East Africa Protectorate order that the said

*Accordingly under the provisions the removal of the said Frederick Linnell is expedient for reasons set forth in the order.*

Frederick Linnell be removed to the United Kingdom there to undergo the residue of his sentence in accordance with the said Act.
