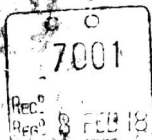

PROCEEDINGS OF MEDICAL BOARD

A Medical Board composed as under, assembled at British General Hospital, on the 17th of August, 1917, for the purpose of reporting on the health of No. 5746 S/Sergt. A.M. Woolf, M.L.B. by Order of A.D.M.S. L of C. No. 88 278 M dated 17.8.17.

The Court having assembled proceed to examine the above named and find that he is suffering from TUBERCLE of the Lungs. The disease originally started in 1903 with Haemoptysis - He went to S. Africa in 1906 and had a tuberculous Testis removed in 1913. The opinion of the board is that he is unfit for further service and recommend that he be discharged from service.

1. Was the disability contracted in Military Service? No.
2. Was it contracted under circumstances over which he had no control? Yes.
3. Was it caused by Military Service? Not caused, aggravated.
4. If caused by Military Service to what specific condition is it attributed? Aggravated by Active Service.
