With reference to your letter No. 28906/1917 of <sup>10th</sup> the 11th June 1917,

I have the honour to enclose a copy of a letter and enclosure received from the Government of the East Africa Protectorate, on the subject of securing under the guarantee bond certain posts held by Europeans, and to request the instructions of the Secretary of State.

2. In accordance with instructions received from the Protectorate Government in August last we arranged with the Guardian Assurance Co. for the removal of the post of Head Godown Keeper from the bond and credited our East Africa account with the sum of £1. 15. 11d, refund of premium in respect of the period 13th April - 31st December, 1917.

With reference to your despatch No. 447 of the 11th June 1917, on the subject of the securing of certain posts held by Europeans in this Protectorate, arrangements have been made whereby the Crown Agents for the Colonies will be notified from time to time of any further post to be secured.

2. The amount of security in the case of the clerk in the Public Works Department may be reduced forthwith, and the three Assistant Engineers in the Public Works Department may be removed from the list.

3. The Crown Agents for the Colonies have already been requested to remove from the list the post of Head Godown

Keeper

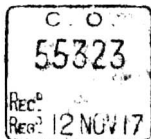
