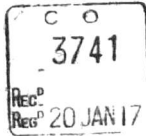

In reply to your letter of the 8th instant, No. 61867/1916 I am commanded by the Army Council to acquaint you, for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that Mrs Schuimyn would have been eligible, upon production of the requisite marriage certificate, for a pension of 22/6 a week for herself and four children, had her husband, the late Lance Corporal C.A. Schuimyn, East African Transport Corps, been serving in the British Army at the time of his death.

The payment in respect of the children would cease on the attainment of 16 years of age.
