With reference to your letter of the 17th ultimo, 2261/1917, covering one from the Foreign Trade Department regarding the relations of Messrs Boucher Mortimore & Co., with Mr Max Klein, I am commanded by the Army Council to acquaint you for the information of Mr Secretary Long, that the suggestion made in War Office letter, numbered as above dated 29th December, 1916, was due to the urgent military needs of this and Allied Countries in respect of hides as well as the undesirable connections of Mr Max Klein.

The supply of goatskins of this class in this country is also understood to be unequal to ^{domestic} requirements.
