Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 30th January 1917, No. 0165/8231 (F.S.) forwarding the enclosed correspondence relative to Conductor J.J. de Jager, East African Transport Corps, I am directed by the Lords and others, Commissioners of this Hospital, to inform you that, had he been serving on an army engagement, they would in the first instance have awarded him a pension of 12/6 a week for 12 months conditional, with effect from the day after the date of discharge, if his rank was equivalent to that of Private, Class V, Article 1134 Royal Warrant.

If his rank were higher than private the rate of pension would be as follows:-

As a N.C.O. of Class IV . . . . .	14/6 a week.
" " " " " " III . . . . .	16/6 " "
" " " " " " II . . . . .	18/6 " "
" " " " " " I . . . . .	20/6 " "
(or Warrant Officer Class II).	
As a Warrant Officer Class I . . . . .	27/6 " "

Shortly before the expiration of the conditional period he would again be examined by a Medical Board (including an Oculist) and his claim to further pension considered.
