As, however, the W.O. likes the scheme it has in all to the good that it should be so far advanced.

(1) Tell C.A. that they may ^{get} order the Chronometer & deck watch (14617) + logage stuff (sending copy of C/12987) bearing in mind that all the stations cannot be erected now and that no buildings have been begun yet. Say that they should get the authority of the M. of M. for sending out the men. And ask that the amended tender may be expedited.

(2) Telegram to Gov. that the plants are now nearly complete & that buildings should therefore be put in hand as soon as possible. Ask, with ref. to EOI/55335/16, whether he desires that the Serendi plant, as well as the Kormangan & Sankar plant, should be shut out now or stored here till required.
