Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 3<sup>rd</sup> instant (48100/1917), I am directed by the Postmaster General to say, in reply to the question raised in paragraph 3, that the presumption in Mr. Bowring's letter of the 2<sup>nd</sup> of July that uniform terminal rates obtain throughout India and throughout South Africa respectively is not strictly correct.

With regard to India, a uniform terminal rate applicable to the whole country, including Burmah, is charged for traffic with places west of India, but for traffic with places east of India other rates apply, and the country is divided for this purpose into two zones (a) Burmah and (b) other places in India. In the case of South Africa, a uniform terminal rate is charged for all traffic with the
