Agrees with G.O.C. info. that matter should have been dealt with by him. Refers also to case of Col. J. Aikweru. In order to avoid possible duplication of recommendations by G.O.C.'s should be info that it is not desirable for them to initiate recommendations unless it is clearly established services were not under notice of G.O.C. in C.

In the case of Colonel Aikweru no recommendation was submitted by the Officer Administering the Government. The recommendation originated in this Office and the case is therefore not in point.

As regards awards to the personnel of the Congo Carrier Corps the Governor of Uganda in 1049D apparently reported on the matter from the Protectorate point of view and it was the War Office who decided to gazette the officers mentioned in it and to give awards in certain cases.

Finally, as regards Nyasaland, <sup>which</sup> it would be brought into the matter if the request made in the third paragraph of the War Office letter <sup>were considered</sup>; ~~but~~ <sup>may</sup> it should be pointed out that --- Nyasaland is in a peculiar position, as General Northey's force is administered by the Colonial Office and recommendations for mentions and awards must necessarily, therefore, pass through the Governor.
