Mr Robinson, Brighton

I take this to mean that Mrs
Watts is entitled to a pension of £2.2.4 a
week from 14 May 1916, instead of the 15/- a
week which she has been receiving. The last para
of 50758 seems to imply that the Ministry of
Pensions expect us to assess the pension, but will
help us if we have any difficulty. The assessment
appears to be in accordance with the example in Page 11
of the annexed Instructions for the Assessment of
Alternative Pensions. I think however that we should
send a copy of their letter, with any enclosure, to the
M.P. and ask whether, if Doris Watts had been in
the British Army at the time of her death, his widow
would have been entitled to £2.2.4 a week for the
date of her death?
