DETENTION IN EGYPT, KIT ALLOWANCE ETC

Called a day or two ago. He has had a fair attack of fever since he saw Dr. Daniels and wanted treatment at a hospital. Mr Fiddian has kindly arranged with Dr. Daniels and Mr Michelli that he should be admitted to the hospital attached to the London School of Tropical Medicine, and the hospital will communicate directly with him in the matter.

Write to him and say that the Congo Agents are being instructed to issue pay to him at 16s/- a day for the months of March, April and May and that he will be regarded as on indefinite leave until he receives further instructions, say that we understand that the Authorities at the London School of Tropical Medicine are in communication with him direct as regards treatment at the hospital attached to the School in the matter which he mentioned when he called at the Colonial Office, say further that authority will be sent to him for re-examination by Dr. Daniels early in May.
