With reference to the appointment of wireless telegraph enginee operators for Jubaland at the N.F.D. I have the honour to inform you that in order to conform as closely as possible to the present scale of salaries ruling in East Africa, I have recommended to the Consulting Electrical Engineers that the salaries of £200 and £300 recommended by them for the above appointments should be divided up as follows:

2. All the wireless operators to be appointed on a fixed salary of £250 p.a. with a duty allowance of £50 if employed at Kiangyo and £100 if employed at one of the inland wireless stations.

3. If their salaries are regarded as £300 they would apparently rank equally or above many of the more senior officers in East Africa. For instance the commanding salaries of the Assistant Telegraph Engineers is £100 and that of the Telegraph Engineer £350.
