## Re: Expenditure incurred in shipping seel for use on Rallways in British hast Africe.

With reference to the correspondence ending with your No. S.16085/III/81 dated the 1Ath June, 1918, respecting the freight energes on soal supplied for use on the Railways in British East Africa, it is probable in the absence of special advice to the Colonial Office that all charges incurred in shipping the soal will be schifed to Protectorate funds deepite the fact that a considerable assumt of the coal in question was not reserved by the Uganda Railway.

- 2. So far as the cost of the coal itself is concerned, it has all been abited to Protesterate funds, and steps have been taken by the Railway Administration to recover the assumts on account of coal debited to Protesterate funds but which was not received by the Uganda Railway.
- 3. It has lately been laid down by the Senior Seval Officer. East Coast of Africa, that debits for all seal taken over for Haval and Transport Services should be raised against the Admiralty - and this is being done as far as the cept of the coal is concerned.
- 4. I enclose a statement showing the distribution of coal debited in Pretestorite Accounts from the first shipment by the "GYFARTHA" which left belongs beyon the Schi April, 1918, to the "CHUMSSAN" which left on the 9th Pebruary, 1918. This statement includes all assumts up to the close of the financial year 1917-1918, and a further statement will be sent you in the course.
- a. It would growtly familitate matters and avoid such unaccessary assembling work if the charges incurred in shipping the onel for the Reliways in Sect Africa could be statebased in ratio to the unmeittee empilied to the different services involved, and that protectasts funds are only charged proportionately with the assemble of coul received by the Ugazas Reliway, so shown in the assembling schools.
- 6. I therefore have the honour to ouggest that a copy of the schedule may be formarted to the Secretary of State for the

Colonies with a view to this being done, and I trust His -Excellency the Acting Governor will approve of this action being taken.
