Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that application has been made by Mrs. Isabella Moon for a military pension in respect of the service in the East Africa Mounted Rifles of her late son, Trooper James Moon, who was killed in action at Longido on the 4th November 1914.

2. I enclose copy of an affidavit which has been filed by Mrs. Moon, who resides at 35 Albert Street, Tayport, Scotland, from which it appears that she was dependent on her late son to the extent of £2 a month.

3. Mrs. Moon would appear to be entitled to a pension at this rate, payable from East Africa Protectorate funds, and I should be glad if instructions could be issued to the Crown Agents for the Colonies to make payment.
