They might let us have 12 K.O.s of the A.C. They have done us well by the matter of the A.C. 7 Officers.

Telegram from the Officer Administering the Government of the East Africa Protectorate to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

(Received Colonial Office 1.55 a.m. 26th September, 1913).

1142. 25th September. Owing to extensive outbreak of stock diseases throughout Protectorate position serious. Would be glad if arrangements could be made for sending out by earliest opportunity twelve stock inspectors with experience stock <sup>trade</sup> able to <sup>ride</sup> carry out under instructions necessary duties such as inoculation against rinderpest. Should be engaged on usual agreement and disabled <sup>possessing</sup> necessary qualifications should receive preference. Vacancies exist under schedule No. 22 item 84 of Estimates for current year. Also require three carefully selected veterinary surgeons with postgraduate training now <sup>in</sup> active military service but able to carry on fieldwork in veterinary departments. These required during absence of <sup>5 Hussars</sup> Steady and to replace Steady who are <sup>expected</sup> resign at <sup>see</sup> despatch 24th August No. 535 and to fill one vacancy. Two <sup>services</sup> should be engaged on usual agreement and one <sup>Stockman</sup> be asked to assist.

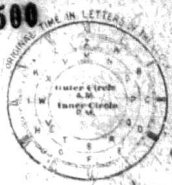
