From the Officer Administering the Government of
the East Africa Protectorate to the Secretary of
State for the Colonies.

(Received Colonial Office 2 p.m. 2nd October, 1918.)

October 2nd. Mombasa municipality.

Your despatch No. 266 of May 18th 1913 and your
Confidential despatch of February 23rd 1909.

Am I correct in supposing that the 1857 treaty
no longer are a bar to taxation in connection with
municipal purposes of subjects of signatory Powers?
I propose if so to raise question again as local
conditions urgently require improvement and it
(is) necessary that cost should be defrayed by
means of municipal rates.
