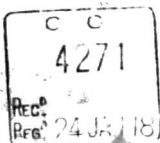

Sir,

11/1917 I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Read's letter of the 2nd instant relative to the repayment to this Department of £107,000 refunded by the War Office to the account of the East Africa Protectorate.

This sum was received by this Department on the 15th instant and will be set off against the debt of the East Africa Protectorate to His Majesty's Treasury at par, as Mr. Long assumes.

As shown in the statement enclosed in Treasury Letter 34179/17 of the 3<sup>rd</sup> November last, the capital sum outstanding in respect of this debt is as follows :

In view of the repayment of £107,000 My Lords propose to cancel the whole of the 3½% debt and to reduce the 5% debt to 26,541.3.3 as on the 15th instant.

With reference to your letter, C.R.V./A/222, of the 7th June last, I am etc. to transmit to you, to be laid before the Minister of Munitions, the accompanying copy of a telegram from the C.A.G. of the E.A.P. asking that a further supply of 2,500,000 one cent pieces may be shipped to the Protectorate as soon as possible;

2. It has been ascertained from the Treasury that the Royal Mint cannot at present undertake this coinage and Mr. Long will be glad if, as on the previous occasion, a priority classification may be given for the execution of the order by the Mint at Birmingham.
