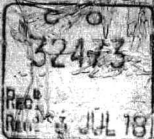

M.C. In reply to Sir H.S. Reid's letters of the 13th April (15465/1918) and 15th May (22785/1918) relative to the position of Postal clerks and Telegraphists seconded for service in the East African Protectorate, I am directed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to request you to inform Mr. Secretary Long that they have informed the Postmaster General that any period of seconded service in excess of three years, during which an officer has been retained in the Protectorate on public grounds may be reckoned at his discretion for increment, in fixing the officers' salary on his return to the home Service.
