Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 18th inst, No. ⁴⁰⁵ 22821/1918., forwarding a copy of a despatch from the Officer Administering the Government of the East Africa Protectorate regarding the disposal of the monthly outstanding balance in the Protectorates Money Order Account with India, I am commanded to inform that on the understanding that the balance in question is available for use locally for military purposes the Council have no objection to the proposal that this Department should repay the Crown Agents for the Colonies at 1/5d per rupee.

I am however to point out that if a separate adjustment in respect of these transactions is considered desirable it will be necessary for a corresponding deduction to be made from the amount of the monthly advance by this Department to the Crown Agents in respect of advances by the Protectorate authorities for military purposes.
