Sir,

With reference to your letter No. 5544/1917 of the 20th of December, relative to Mr F. W. Davies formerly a Sergeant in the Ordnance Department of the East Africa Protectorate Forces, I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to inform you that Mr Davis has been examined by a Medical Board, who report that he is suffering from Malaria, due to Military Service, and "Valvular Disease of the Heart aggravated by Military Service". His disablement is assessed as "total" and he is deemed to have been discharged from the British Army he would have been awarded a pension of £10 a week with the appropriate rate allowance for children under 16 years of age, from 1st October, at the end of which period he may be re-examined with a view to the consideration of his claim to further pension.
