TELEGRAM 1918

Sir,

With reference to your letter No. 5544/1917 of the 20th of January, relative to Mr F. G. Davies formerly a Sergeant in the ~~Quarantine Department~~ of the East African Native State Forces, I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to inform you that Mr Davies has been examined by a Medical Board who report that he is suffering from Malaria due to Military Service, and "Valvular Disease of the Heart" aggravated by Military service. His disablement is assessed as "total" and Major Pay allowances from the British Army he would have been awarded if pensioned for a week after his discharge. The allowance for children under 16 years of age, for a period of six months from October, at the end of which period he will be re-examined with a view to the consideration of his claim to further pension.
