My Lord,

With reference to Your Lordship's predecessor's despatch No. 772 of the 22nd October 1918, approving of the grant of pension to Mr. Sunt Singh at the rate of £28/- 18/- per annum, with effect from the 4th October 1918, I have the honour to submit the following for Your Lordship's sympathetic consideration.

2. (a) Mr. Sunt Singh joined the service of the Uganda Railway on the 3rd June, 1899, and was transferred therefrom to the Medical Department on the 1st April, 1904, receiving a bonus of 5% on his salary for that period, severing his connection with the Railway Department.

(b) His acceptance of this bonus can be regarded as an acknowledgment of the obligations of Government as regards his period of service prior to April, 1904, in so far as that service could not be reckoned towards his total service for pension and, had Mr. Sunt Singh been aware of this, he would not have accepted the bonus.

It would appear hard that, for the sum of Rs. 36/- Mr. Sunt Singh should be deprived of nearly five years service; and I strongly recommend that this service may be added to that for which he has already received pension, and that his pension may be increased to £39. 5. 4 per annum, accordingly, subject to the deduction of the bonus paid. I would draw Your Lordship's attention to the very excellent manner in which Mr. Sunt Singh carried out his duties in the Medical Department, as shown by the Principal Medical Officer in the pension form which was forwarded with my despatch No. 500 of the 14th August 1918, and trust that the circumstances of the case may be considered worthy of Your Lordship's favourable consideration.
