- (2) Put up list which will now be available showing which Somaliland vacancies have to be filled - there are 2 vacancies (Castle Smith + Lawrence) - are these two District Comm<sup>r</sup> vacancies to be filled from outside & not by promotion, according to what appears in the papers?
- (3) What is the exact position now as regards Kirby? Is he returning to East? Was he D.C. or A.D.C. in S. Land?

(1) T.D. BUTLER Born 1896. Appointed Post Office Comm<sup>r</sup> I.A.S. 27 July 1900. Qualified Subaltern. Confidential report as follows: "Is doing good work in the Northern Frontier District. Shows capacity, tact and a strong sense of discipline" (Gen. Belfield 1.1.17)

"Should be selected for promotion who has continued to perform most valuable services in the Northern Frontier District." (Col. Gen. Denny 20.1.18)

This officer has lately been appointed acting D.C., Meru, where he is very highly spoken of by his Provincial Commr. I have formed a very high opinion of Mr. Butler's capabilities.  
(Acty Gov. Baring 1. 1. 19)

The Gov. (Sir G. Murray) recommended Mr. Butler for promotion to D.C., having over F. W. Bell, but the S.P.S. did not approve, & approved the promotion of the latter. The Gov. stated that Mr. Butler had shown exceptional ability.

A. C. KIRBY Born 1889 Appointed Post District Commr.  
E.A.P. 26. 12. 1913. Served for Somali in Somaliland  
9 Sept. 1918. Left Somaliland on leave 5 April. 1919.

Confidential reports as follows: -

"Professional ability & administrative ability respectively reported as 'fair' (Acty Gov. Baring 16. 7. 18)

This officer is temporarily serving in Somaliland.

No report for Somaliland. (Acty Gov. Baring 1. 1. 19)

V. G. GLENDAY Born 1891 Appointed Assistant District Commr. E.A.P. 26. 12. 1913. Acting District Commissioner.

Confidential reports as follows: -

Is very well reported on by the officer in charge of the Northern Frontier District. (Acty Gov. Baring 16. 1. 1915)

"He performed exceptionally good work in the Northern Frontier District." (Acty Gov. Baring 1. 1. 19)

P. R. FILLEUL Born 1885. Appointed Post District Commr. E.A.P. 27 July 1910.

Confidential reports as follows: -

Quite satisfactory. (Gov. Belfield 10. 5. 16)

Well reported on, but has not yet passed in either Language or Law. (Gov. Belfield 1. 1. 17)

Very well reported on for his work in Jubaland.

(Acty Gov. Baring 14. 1. 19)

Does well in the Nyanga Frontier, which he is very well reported on. (Acty Gov. Baring 1. 1. 19)

District Commissioner S.A.P. 28.3.1912

Confidential reports as follows:-

"Shows competency in administration and is generally promising." (Gen Belfield 1.1.19)

"A very promising officer with plenty of common sense which has been very valuable to him in the Northern Frontier District." (Acty Sec. Bowring 16.1.18)

"I have nothing to add to my remarks of last year." (Acty Sec. Bowring, 1.1.19)

(2) Yes as regards Castle Smith's vacancy (see minutes on <sup>70</sup>2652 - house now annexed), and no doubt also as regards Major Lawrence's - that is, to be filled from outside.

(3) The despatch to Smalldale No. 138 of 5<sup>th</sup> Oct 1918 on File E.A. shows that Mr. Kelly was to remain there for the duration of the war. I think it might assume further, and from Sir E. Huxley's suggestion in tel. of 23 June 1919 (No. 6) that he should have been employed, that he is to return to S.A.P.

It is not clear whether he was Post D.S. or D.T. in Smalldale. In the medical certificate (No. 11) he is called D.T. He probably so noted.
