THE PORT CAPTAIN ORDINANCE, 1919.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS  
AND REASONS.

This Bill has been introduced to carry into effect a proposed change in the designation of the Port Officer *Marina* i.e. to Port Captain. The reasons for the change ~~is~~ the fact that the Port Officer has represented that as such he is liable to be confused with subordinate officers and that he should be styled "Port Captain". Legislation is necessary because the Port Officer has duties and powers assigned to him by various Ordinances and Rules under Ordinances.

2. The Bill in my opinion may properly be enacted by the Governor.
