I am not inclined to upset anyone else in order to promote the "Sydney" scheme. 6th August No. 621. Your telegram 29th July, Syndicates,
Girouard's Syndicate can be accommodated to extent of 3,000
acres South of Kericho. Syndicate conditions similar to
Class B. Cannot guarantee any further land for syndicates
and suggest that no more applications be entertained unless
London Selection Board desire to allot farms reserved for
home allotment for this purpose. Mr MacLennan withdrew
application here before allotment under a misapprehension
that they could apply as a syndicate after 14th June this
cannot be allowed and they are ineligible as members of non-
local syndicate being local applicants. MacLennan London has
been selected here individually.
