A Bill

Intituled.

An Ordinance to make Further and Better Provision for the Enforcement and Execution of the Judgments, Decrees and Orders of His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Execution of Judgments (Court of Appeal) Ordinance, 1919." Short title.

2. Any Court in the Protectorate shall conform with and execute any judgment, decree, or order which the Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa may think fit to make in a cause or matter coming before it from such Court, in like manner as any judgment, decree, or order of such Court should or might have been executed. Execution of Judgments etc., of Court of Appeal.

3. The provisions of the foregoing section shall also apply to any decree or order issued by the Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa for conformity with or in execution of an order made by the Privy Council. Execution of Privy Council judgments.
