States wishes with regard to proposals for removal.

At last it looks as if this business will be settled. I think it is safe to assume that the drinking fountain will be placed under or near the Memorial Building which the Gov. proposes shall be designated as a park to the Baraza (14914). ^{For use of the proposed memorial} But before writing to the Gov. I think we had better wait for Lt. Colonel Jenner's view - see last part of this letter.

The notes of this letter say that Mr. W. assumes that the Gov. intends to have the new Drinking Fountain placed under or near the Memorial Building, and that he will be informed that his proposals are approved on that understanding; add that if Lt. Col. Jenner will call at the C.O. on any weekday except Saturday, between the hours of 10. and 5 a member of the C.O.

14914/1914 dated 28th April
1914. I beg to say that,
provided the proposed
drinking fountain (which
I understand from your
letter 88059/1913 dated
10th Nov 1913, will consist
of a mosquito proof mesh
bell

Water pump & roof) will be
constructed either on
alongside the Memorial
at the new site, I quite
approve of the suggestion
proposed by the Governor
of the East Africa Protectorate
that the Memorial Building
be set, as now constructed,
should form a species
of Portico to the Baraza
Also that the Tablet

should be reversed and a
fresh inscription cut, in
English & Arabic, in the
words proposed in your
letter of 28th April 1914.

It would however be a
matter of regret to me, if
the Memorial was not at
the same spot as the
existing fountain. 355
