In continuation of our letter of the 5th November, I have the honour to enclose a copy of a telegram from the Government of the East Africa Protectorate stating that a circular regarding the amendment of the allowance for detention at Mombasa was issued on the 16th July. In view of this fact, and as it is impossible for us to ascertain whether an officer claiming the allowance proceeded to Mombasa before it was absolutely necessary, we propose, subject to the Secretary of State's approval, to refer back any claims that may be received, and not to issue any circular to the East Africa Protectorate officials at present on leave.
