I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter
55942/1919 of the 19th November stating that the Government of
the East Africa Protectorate is unable to agree to the appointment
of Mrs. Scott as Assistant to the Pig & Dairy Expert, for which
appointment the Hon. H.J.H. Scott is under consideration.

Mr. Scott was advised accordingly and at a recent interview
with us, stated that his wife is willing to assist Him in his duties
without salary, if he is appointed, and asked whether, in
consideration of her services, a free passage may be provided.

We shall therefore be glad to be advised whether the
Secretary of State approves of the engagement of Mr. Scott, subject
to his passing the medical examination, and of the provision of a free
passage for Mrs. Scott.

In the event of his appointment being approved, we have to
decide whether he should receive any allowance while undergoing
the course of instruction mentioned in the second paragraph of our
letter of the 1st October.
