REPORT of the DIRECTOR OF COLONIAL AUDIT on the Account of the Treasurer of the Protectorate of East Africa for the year ended the 31st of March, 1917.

As certified thereon, the above mentioned Account, together with the Statement of Assets and Liabilities on the 31st of March, 1917, has been examined under my directions.

2. The questions which arose in the course of examination have been satisfactorily settled as far as possible, but a few points in connection with the accounts of this and the two preceding years still await final settlement.

3. Certain errors of classification, included in the account as rendered, were brought to notice and admitted by the Treasurer too late for adjustment, but, with the following exceptions, they were of minor importance:-


(i) A sum of £3.14.8 was credited to Revenue Head VI, "Post and Telegraphs" instead of to Expenditure Head XIX "Miscellaneous Services".

(ii) A sum of £1.6.8 was credited to Expenditure Head XXIV, "Public Works Recurrent" instead of to Revenue Head VIII "Rents of Government Property".

(iii) A sum of £6.10.0 was charged to Expenditure Head XXa, "Post Office and Telegraphs, Special Expenditure" instead of to Head XX "Post Office and Telegraphs".

4. The account also includes an incorrect adjustment, debiting railway expenditure and crediting loan funds with a sum of £9,000 intended to meet replacements of rolling stock to be effected in a subsequent year. In accordance with the instructions of the Secretary of State the amount has been written back to revenue in the account for the year 1918-19.

5. The question referred to in paragraph 4 of my report for the previous year has been settled and the necessary adjustments, transferring to a special reserve account the unexpended balance under "Other Charges" 3rd Battalion K.A.R., have been made by the Treasurer in the account for the year 1917-18.
