I have had to neglect my work.

I had a friendly interview with His Excellency during the time of the epidemic, and, although he was not inclined to discuss official matters, I managed to broach the question of the Magt Mission and I asked him how soon his representatives would be ready to start. As I expected, he replied that he could not give a definite answer as he did not know whether they had been ill or not. I requested him to make enquiries and he now informs me that they have been ill and have gone to their homes. As I pressed him to recall them I thought Honourable's
