Your telegram No. 121 -

(? Government) now promise me their commission will be present in forty days.

I consider it advisable to press for demands 1 and 3.

There will be suggestion that demand 2, be held in reserve and nominally cover (2. Groups undecypherable) and it is sufficient to ask Government to recognise frontier as pointed out by British Commissioner.

I recommend we should press for a delimitation of whole of the East African frontier as soon as political situation is a little more settled.
