In reply to Your Lordship's telegram No 108 of  
10th and in confirmation of my telegram No 14  
I have the honour to give my opinion that military  
occupation of the East African Protectorate frontier  
is not advisable in view of the continued very  
unsatisfactory condition of Abyssinian territory bordering  
on the frontier.

The Abyssinian Government in the past always regarded  
protection of its frontiers as a secondary consideration.  
In fact they have been occupied with their internal  
disorders and, the military administration of the East  
African Protectorate frontier will confirm this impression.

I have not been asked for my opinion from the  
military point of view of this change but, I venture  
to suggest that, in the light of our occupation of  
territory claimed by the Abyssinian Government as  
belonging to them we should be well advised to insure  
the safety of the lines of communication with Gaddaduna  
and to provide for all eventualities. This can only be  
done honourable.

I do not anticipate, at the present time, that,  
Abyssinian Government would be foolish enough to  
not to force our evacuation but, it is always well  
prepared for all eventualities. The fact, more  
of military administration of our frontier would  
make them of any such attempt.

Further, I can tell the Abyssinian Government that  
we have been forced to take this step by their utter  
failure to make any attempt to establish order on their  
frontiers and for no other reason.

I believe military administration of the frontier  
will have a salutary effect in general on the minds  
of Abyssinians.

I have to ask that I may be informed when the  
time is to take place as it will be necessary to  
inform carefully the reason of this change to the  
Abyssinian Government.

I am addressing copies of this despatch to Cairo,  
Khartoum and Nairobi.
