Sir,

I am directed by Mr. Secretary Shortt to refer to your letter of the 22nd ultimo on the subject of Mr. R.F. Mayer's application for a certificate of naturalisation and to say for the information of Viscount Milner that Mr. Shortt understands from unofficial communications which have passed between the Department that Mr. Mayer has for some little time ceased to hold a commission, or to be serving, in H.M. Forces, and he therefore is not in a position to benefit by the provisions of section 2(6) of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, as amended in 1918, according to which a period spent in the service of the Crown may be treated as equivalent to a period spent in the United Kingdom.
