

The facts were accordingly communicated to the British East African authorities by the Director of our Central Intelligence Department with our knowledge and approval. It was never anticipated that this action would lead the Protectorate Covernment to refuse to honour the passports and we still think that had we omitted to indicate the character of the two individuals to the British East African authorities we should have incurred a grave responsibility. Looking back, however, on the unexpected results of the procedure followed in the case, we agree that it might have been better if we had consulted the Protectorate

Government before issuing the passports.



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
