6. In regard to the assistants required, it will be seen that they have to be selected with special care, for experience has shown that the professional or other qualifications will not be enough, and that the nature of the work is such that it can be satisfactorily and successfully done only by those who have an interest in the special line, and the necessary patience required. The officers I have in view are those in Service in the State referred to above, and have had some experience in connection with the work.

7. The number of assistants required in my Division is rather small, and so it is likely that they may have to be recruited in proportion to the demand for services, so that the work may be done to an efficient and by time.

8. It is hoped that the services of several staff assistants will be available in next session.
