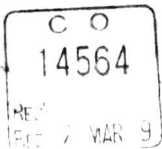

Sir,

In reply to Mr. Grindie's letter of the 29th^{Gen} January last (3238/1919), relative to the supply of subsidiary coinage to the East Africa Protectorate, I am directed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to request you to inform the Secretary of State for the Colonies that the Deputy Master of the Royal Mint has been authorised to strike 50,000 Rupees worth of 50 cent pieces for the British East Africa Protectorate. Owing to the heavy demands for imperial bronze coinage, the Royal Mint are unable to undertake the five cent coinage but they understand that the Birmingham Mint will be able to undertake it if desired.
