

passages to England on discharge (but not a return passage) provided that their service exceeded one year. Since then the alternative proposal has been put to the W.O. and the Treas. that these people should have a free passage to England and back to E.A., provided they have put in a minimum qualifying tour of 20 or 24 months but not otherwise, except in cases of invaliding.

We have now obtained approval for this modification, and it represents all that we can do if we are not to have demands for similar treatment (i.e. single passages after 18 months) from the countless invalids and dependents of the F.A.P.

It is proposed to send a telegram as Mr. [unclear] has done. It is decidedly unfortunate that our first telegram in 1883, as appears from 18830, been treated as a receipt ruling. It has been allowed to become known and expectations have been raised.

You will see from the minutes on 11275 /Nyasaland that in that case it is proposed to deal specially with applications for passages home where hardship exists, e.g. where people unofficially employed have lost, through their military service, the right to a passage home at the expense of their employers. In this general case ^{case} we should ~~be glad~~ to give special treatment in hard cases if any are brought to our notice as a result of the telegram now to be sent.
