Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Grindle's letter of the 24th ultimo (29961/19), with its enclosures respecting the proposed increase of war bonus in the Protectorates of East Africa, Uganda, Nyasaland and Zanzibar.

In reply I am to request you to inform Secretary Viscount Milner that, while My Lords regret that it has been necessary to submit these proposals without any estimate of the approximate expenditure involved, They sanction their adoption for Uganda and Nyasaland, with which alone They are concerned, with effect from the 1st January 1917.

With regard to the recommendation that war bonus should not reckon for pension, I am to observe that My Lords have agreed to certain increases of awards of superannuation to persons drawing war bonus, the details of which ^{were} ~~will be~~ communicated to you in a Circular ^{of the 3rd instant (L. 232/19)} ~~of the~~ issued at an early date. It will probably be impracticable

War bonus for officials of East Africa,
Uganda and Zanibar.

As arranged on the telephone this morning, I append various questions which have already arisen on this subject, and shall be glad if you will give me the replies as soon as possible.

- (1) Men seconded for service with the Imperial Forces under the terms of the Secretary of State's circular letter of the 26th August 1914 - in the case of these, I understand that the bonus is to be added to the civil salary for the purpose of arriving at the Colonial allowance payable?
- (2) Men seconded from one of the Protectorates to the Occupied Territory G.E.A. - do they get bonus or merely the 10s/- a day local allowance, given to officials of the Occupied Territory?
- (3) With regard to the question of married or single, I am arranging, as suggested by you, to circularise all the men, asking them under what category they come, and requesting that their reply should take the form of an honour certificate - I understood from you that you thought this would be sufficient and that documentary evidence need not be obtained. The latter would be a colossal job, so I hope you will not change your mind.
- (4) Date from which the War bonus takes effect. The instructions received from your Department under the authority of G.O.L. 61006/1918 of the 31st January 1918 gave the 1st January 1917 as the date of the East Africa Protectorate and the 1st January 1918 in Uganda and C.O.L. of the 13th instant gives no date though it would appear that the arrangements for G.E.A., Uganda and Zanibar are all alike now, and the date should therefore be taken as 1st January 1917. Is this correct, please?
- (5) With regard to adjustments. In the case of men who have been on military service or retired, either with or

without

without pay previous to the grant of an honorarium
or whose salary was of such a nature that they could
have received any payment locally, we can, I presume
an adjustment forthwith, assuming that it is a
bonus is paid, as in the case of West Africa, to
who has retired under any circumstances.
