Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Sir H. Read's letter of the 12th instant (69047/19) with enclosed copy of correspondence with the British East African Disabled Officers Colony limited regarding an application for an advance of 100 tons of flax seed by His Majesty's Government on a guarantee of deferred payment.

In reply I am to request you to inform Viscount Milner that Their Lordships regret that They are unable to sanction this proposal, which would be contrary to Their general policy with regard to the disposal of surplus Government property.

The Secretary of State has made it clear to the Society in the correspondence enclosed with letter under reply that no financial assistance of any kind can be given. If the security which the Society offers for the proposed loan by His Majesty's Government is good the Society will no doubt apply to the Under Secretary of State,

Failing this it will appear to be necessary for the

Dear Amery,

I am sorry to have to return an unfavourable reply to your official and unofficial letters of the 12th instant on the subject of a proposed sale of 100 tons of Flax seed to the British East Africa Disabled Officers Colony Limited on a guarantee of deferred payment.

It is rather unsatisfactory that despite the definite warning given by the Colonial Office the company should already be appealing for financial assistance in this form.

It would be extremely awkward to allow credit sales to an Association of Exofficers. The Disposal Board have steadily resisted with our support the preferential treatment of ex service men in respect of the sales of stores.

In any case this is really a case for the Company's Bankers; and there is nothing in the papers to show that their Bankers would not be willing to make the necessary advance of cash on the security of their uncalled capital and the machinery which they are prepared to pledge. The Treasury, I am sure, ought not to

to be concerned with it.

You might perhaps consider whether the Crown Agents might not step in (if the Company's Bankers are unwilling) as Agents for the British East Africa Protectorate, who might then maintain some supervision over the Disabled Officers Colony.
