

I am commanded by the Army Council to forward for your information copies of correspondence which has passed regarding the grant of passage to the United Kingdom to officers and other ranks of the local East African forces, commissioned or enlisted locally in East Africa.

The Council would propose, subject to the concurrence of the Secretary of State for the Colonies to sanction the concessions outlined in Treasury letter of 20th December 1918, 47592/18, an the understanding that any officer or man who is not destined to serve in the post bellum army is demobilized locally and travels to the United Kingdom as a civilian without amy pay or allowences. As the incidence of charge would follow the general principles governing expenditure on the East African Campaign the Council would be glad of the Secretary of State's on orience in the proposals, before sanction is given.

I am commanded by the Army Council to inform you that they have had under reconsideration the question of the provision of passages or Officers who are required to leave East Africa after two years! service in that country for recuperative purposes.

Officers serving in Expeditionary Force areas, who proceed

on leave, are granted indulgence passages on Transports, and with their Lordships sanction, free rail conveyance from Taranto or areeilies to their destinations in the United Kingdom, but so ransports proceed from Bast Afgles to the United Kingdem and no appartunities at present occur to enable the Officers in question to tranship interressels proceeding via the Cape to the United Bingdom. in reply I am to observe that if the conditions of the armistics are fulfilled, heatilities in Bust Africa will shortly dome to an end and demonstration will begin. In the circumstances I am to suggest that there will be no longer any necessity for proceeding with the Army council's passaul as the officers in question will presumably be brought homeperore long at the public expense with a view to being demobilized in the United Kingdom.

With reference to War Office letter of the 5th November 1918 - No.0165/67 - regarding the provision of passages for officers after 2 years service in EAST AFRICA, and the Tresury reply of the 18th November 1918 - No.42521/19 - I am commanded by the Army Council to say that there may be cases of officers who will continue to serve in EAST AFRICA and, in their gass, the Council consider that the concession of free lesse asked for the necessary one. The Council will therefore be glad of their locations of the concurrence in the proposal.

The Council have also received a capital raquest from the General Officer Commanding, BAST AFRICA that carticers and sther ranks of the local EAST AFRICAN Forces, commissioned or salisted locally, may be alrowed to proceed as the United binguin for telesse or discharge provided that their service exceeds 1 years and that if their service exceeds 1 years hey may be already and that if their service exceeds 1 years hey may be already they desire to do so. In view of the fact that these effects and men are all, to some degree, suffering from the effects of their military service under trying official conditions, the Council consider that the concession might reasonably be given, and they would ask their Lordships sanction at an early date.

In reply to Mr. Cubitt's letter of the 10th instant (0165/284 (F.5.)), regarding the provision of free passages to officers serving in East Africa, I am directed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to say that They sanction the concession asked for in War Office letter of the 5th ultimo to those officers who will continue to serve in Bast Africa, provided they have had 2 years service in that country.

As regards the proposal in the second paragraph of the letter under reply, My Lords would not in any case feel justified in sanctioning the grant of a return passage to the United Kingdom free of cost to officers and other ranks of the local East African Forces, commissioned or epilsted locally. It however the Army Council are able to adsure them that the concession will not be extended to personnel serving in other countries than East Africa. They are prepared to sanction the grant to such officers and men of a free passage to this country (but not back against on or service exceeds I year as an exceptional, arrangement owing to the trying climatic conditions of the local campaign.
