Sir,

I am commanded by the Army Council to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No. 30725/1918, dated 26th December, 1918, regarding the proposed pardon of political offenders convicted by Military Courts under martial Law in East Africa.

2. In reply I am to say that the Council, while concurring generally in the proposal that general authority be given to the Officer Administering the Government of the East Africa Protectorate to exercise his discretion in the manner indicated in his telegram of the 14th December, suggest that an officer of the East Africa Intelligence Staff, nominated by the General Officer Commanding, be added to the Advisory Committee; and further request that particulars of any persons released in accordance with those proposals may be forwarded to the Director of Military Intelligence for his information.
