I am directed to acquaint you that Major B. Maynard Sadler, East African Protectorate Force, was granted an Imperial commission and served on the staff in East Africa as Commandant, 2nd Class, from 14th September 1916 to 1st October 1917.

He drew pay locally while in East Africa, and the Crown Agents for the Colonies while on sick leave in this country, from the 1st October 1917 to the 31st January 1919.

He is entitled to a gratuity under the provisions of the Pay Warrant, and I am directed that you will issue the necessary instructions to the Crown Agents to arrange the issue of the same.
