SIR,

With reference to your letter of the 10th instant, No. 1704/1919 regarding the proposed grant of war bonus and leave on demobilisation to officers and European other ranks of the local East African and Nyasaland Forces, I am commanded by the Army Council to acquaint you that in view of Mr. Milner's representations they will raise no objection to the grant of war bonus at the rates suggested. It is presumed that as in the case of the King's African Rifles the grant will not take effect from any date earlier than 1st October 1919.

As regards the grant of leave on demobilisation the Council are unable to agree to the suggestions made. In the case of officers who have held temporary commissions in the Imperial Forces and who have been called upon to serve in any sphere of operations pay ceases from the date following that of actual demobilisation without the privilege of any leave. It is held that the gratuity under Article 497 Pay Warrant to which they become entitled was sufficient remuneration. The members of these locally raised Forces will annualise after their demobilisation the pay and allowances due to them in respect of their present treatment. Their position is not the same as that of officers of the King's African Rifles which is a permanent force and in which the grant of leave is a condition of service.

In the case of other ranks the regulations in the Imperial Forces lay down that furlough shall be granted for 28 days from the date of demobilisation with pay and allowances. The Council sees no objection to a like concession being made to European non-commissioned officers of the local forces.
