

or more than 30 months service in the Protectorate to be followed
by leave for the period of the voyage to this country, and the days
spent in the healthy or unhealthy districts of the Protectorate.
Government quarters free of rent are provided when available;
allowance is given for rent on duty.

The Colonial Office will do its best to find a suitable
place for tropical veterinary work in Uganda. The candidate
should have, if possible, post graduate training in pathology
and bacteriology.

The terms offered are identical with those now in force
in the Protectorate.
