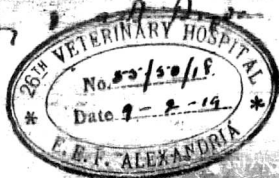

The Government of the East African Protectorate has asked for carefully selected Veterinary Officers with postgraduate training, able to carry out field work in the Protectorate.

The salary is at the rate of £400 a year, and the officer will be appointed in the first instance for a term of not less than 30 months service in the Protectorate to be followed by leave for the period of his voyage to this country, and for 60 days for each completed month of service for his travelling expenses in the healthy or unhealthy districts of the Protectorate. Government quarters free of rent are provided upon application. Maternity Allowance is given from July.

The detailed terms of service are set out in the enclosed leaflet for tropical work in Uganda. The candidate will have, if possible, post graduate training in pathology or bacteriology.

The terms offered are identical with those for the Protectorate.

Will you please call for volunteers for this service and if it may be by cable as soon as possible.
