I have asked C.A. for a detailed list showing local force  
reports from K.A.C. of those who have not been booked for  
August. I am not clear if W.O. will take in K.A.C. in  
cases but I think they may. The W.O. will probably also

be willing to repatriate the wives (at the husband's cost)  
which will relieve our priority lists, but will  
sting them the demand that these wives should  
be repatriated free as in ~~casual~~ cases. I  
presume that Govt or K.A.R. officers, who are  
also civil Govt officials, should be kept  
under this scheme & so relieve "the C.A."  
altogether. In their case there will be the  
additional complication that they will be  
entitled to the difference between pre-war &  
present cost of their wives' passage.  
I afraid it will be too much to hope that we  
will take on the wives, who are in this country,  
while their husbands after removal to Africa  
local forces, are in E. Africa, but they could  
not be avoided.


