In the C.A. local force chaplains were not employed in contract (Col A. 5847 m 22 346/19), but the O. do not now consider that they should be barred from receiving a gratuity. The question started with ref to R.C. Chaplains, but it now seems to refer to all local force chaplains. I think we can agree to this.

2. Selg. Gen. G. P. Nyaraland & that Chaplains of F.O. & Nyaraland forces should be given gratuity on completion of service of 90 days pay at Brit. Army rate of their rank for every year or part of a years service & ask him to report to Nyaraland & G.C.A. & to Mr. Court.

Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 19th June 1919, ^{WO} 37218/1919, I am commanded by the Army Council to acquaint you that there are roughly two types of Chaplains employed during the emergency.

- (a) Those employed as acting Chaplains and given special rates of pay.
- (b) Those employed with temporary commissions on contract with the pay and allowances of their rank and a gratuity of 60 days pay for each year or part of a year.

Provided the Chaplains referred to were paid the usual rates of Army Pay applicable to officers holding commissions as Chaplains of the East Africa Local Forces there is no objection in this Department to the issue of gratuities at the appropriate British rate of pay, but it is considered that the issue should not exceed that admissible for temporary Chaplains employed by this Department, (see (b) above).
