and am now on leave pending repatriation (attached to officer's
Wing. Repat: Pirbright.)

My present Army Agents Holt & Co. say they can only draw for the period, that they have been my agents for, namely while I was in the South Irish Horse.

I applied to the Colonial Office for the remainder i.e. while in the East African Protectorate Forces but they have informed me that they forwarded my application to you. I made this application last February and since then have only had the Colonial Office notification of it being forwarded to you.
