Mr. and Mrs. Lundin are Swedish subjects and I cannot therefore grant them a passport; but I am prepared to state that they are, as far as I know, in every way deserving of recognition and assistance. They have been domiciled in this Protectorate for several years and have been engaged in Missionary work during the whole of that period.

3. They have stated their intention of travelling to Sweden via South Africa and Great Britain.
